

# **Calthorpe Residents Society Newsletter**

In response to members' feedback, we highlight in this month's newsletter two local charities that CRS are involved with, and to which you may contribute if you so wish. These are the Birmingham-based charity **'Suited for Success'** and an Edgbaston-based food bank initiative.

### **Suited For Success**



CRS have been working with the 'Suited for Success' charity to organize an event in March for our members.

'Suited for Success' is based in Ladywood. It provides free interview clothes, styling advice and interview presentation skills for unemployed men and women looking for work.

They take donations of new or gently worn suits and smart clothing (shirts, skirts, shoes, dresses etc) which are suitable to wear for a job interview. They also run workshops, coaching sessions and a job club, all with the aim of tackling the barriers that the unemployed in Birmingham face on their journey to employment.

**Chapter** in Greenfield Crescent have kindly agreed to host a coffee morning on **Saturday 25<sup>th</sup> March** where you will be able to drop off your donations, talk to the charity about their activities and enjoy a complimentary coffee courtesy of CRS.

So please save the date in your diaries and, before then, take a look through your wardrobes to see if you have any suitable clothes that you would be willing to donate. More detailed information on this event will be circulated nearer the date.

## **Edgbaston Community Centre Food Bank**

CRS are also happy to provide details of the **'Food Drive'** run by **Edgbaston Community Centre** located on the edge of the Calthorpe Estate.

The food drive is run in partnership with the food retailers **Co-op** and **Pret**, and with organisations including **Fair Share** and **The Community Fund**.

Whilst they receive deliveries of perishable items from local supermarkets etc, they are also particularly in need of tinned food items, toiletries, toilet rolls, and shampoo.

CRS members may drop off their donations at the Community Centre (40 Woodview Drive, Edgbaston B15 2HU) between 10am and 4pm on any weekday.

### **First Port Walk In Surgeries**

A reminder that First Port (ex-Mainstay) are holding fortnightly 'come and meet the team' surgeries at the Boston Tea Party at 30 Harborne Road Edgbaston B15 3AA.

The surgeries commenced on 10<sup>th</sup> January and are held on the second and fourth Tuesday of each month from 1430 to 1630. They have proved very popular to date.

These meetings give Calthorpe Estate residents an opportunity to meet face-to-face the key members of First Port's team on the Estate, to discuss any aspect of the service provided by First Port to residents.
